When Mark first contacted National Energy Action, he was going through a really difficult time. His partner had recently passed away unexpectedly, and he was struggling with grief.

Although he had managed to access bereavement counselling, he said it was only his two beloved cats that were keeping him going.

Not only that, but Mark was also dealing with ongoing health issues of his own. His recent PIP application had been rejected. Whilst he appealed that decision, Mark was left with very little money to live on.

On top of all this, he was finding it difficult to afford his energy bills, despite making cutbacks. One of our advisers worked with Mark to make sure he wouldn't have to suffer in the cold in his own home.

Mark had less than £5 on each meter. So, we arranged for an immediate fuel voucher to help him keep the heating on as the winter weather closed in. We then helped Mark resolve issues with a smart prepayment meter that wasn't

accepting top-ups. The meter showed a debt of £100, causing Mark a lot of stress and worry.

Our adviser was able to get a letter of authority so she could talk to the supplier on Mark's behalf. They discovered that the serial number on the meter didn't match the one on their system, so our adviser was able to challenge the amount owed, negotiate a repayment plan, and ask for compensation.

With our interventions, the supplier agreed to waive the amount Mark owed – a total of £450. Missed Energy Bills Support Scheme payments, totalling £400, were also applied to the meter. This £850 proved vital for Mark amid the energy crisis.

Following National Energy Action's support, Mark said: 'I want to thank you for everything you have done for me. You have been brilliant.'

Thanks to the incredible efforts of our fundraisers, we can help more people like Mark.

HOST A BAKE SALE

Discover your inner Mary Berry and whip up some delicious treats to sell to family, friends and colleagues.



Whether you're looking to try something new or beat your own PB, why not put your strength and stamina to the test with a sporty challenge? Whether it's a run, walk, dance-athon, or football tournament – there's definitely something for everyone! Check out www.nea.org.uk as we may have places for events too.



Put your friends' knowledge to the test and set up your own pub quiz. For an extra boost, see if you can secure prizes from local businesses for bonus rounds

and raffles.



Take your fundraising to work and suggest fancy dress Friday in the office. Ask employees to chip in to take part. For bonus points, ask your employer to match the donation!

TIPS TO MAKE YOUR FUNDRAISING A SUCCESS

START STRONG

Set a target and ask a close friend or family member to make the first donation – people will be more generous if they see a significant donation already on your page.

BE PERSISTENT

Share your page link regularly on social media – this might feel awkward but remember not everyone who follows you sees all your posts.

PROUD SUPPORTER LOGO

You can use this logo on your JustGiving page, in social media posts, or on your blog.



MAKE IT EASY

The easier it is for people to access your page, the more likely they are to donate. Add your JustGiving page link to your social media bio so it's easy to find. If you use an email signature, add the link there too.



If your supporters are UK taxpayers, ask them to Gift Aid their donation. This allows us to claim an extra 25p for every £1 donated from the Government, without any extra cost to them.

ADD IN YOUR PERSONALITY

Add a photo of you, say what you are doing and why. Passion is infectious, so if you share a personal connection to our work and what inspires you to support people living in fuel poverty, people will be more likely to donate.

KEEP ENGAGING

If you're training for a physical challenge, post training updates on your fundraising page or ask sponsors to set training challenges for you so they feel like they are a part of your journey. Don't forget to update your network on how much you've raised. You could say thank you to everyone who helps you reach the halfway mark – this will encourage others to contribute.

HAVE FUN!

Most importantly, don't forget to have fun and enjoy your fundraising journey.

RAFFLES AND LOTTERIES

Holding a raffle or lottery is a fantastic way to raise funds but you may need a licence. Remember you have to be over 16 to buy a ticket.

INSURANCE AND RISK ASSESSMENTS

If you're holding your fundraising event at a venue, most will already have insurance in place, but it's best to see if there is anything additional you may need. You'll also be responsible for carrying out your own risk assessments and taking any necessary health and safety precautions.




