Grace's Story

Grace* has cancer and is unable to work. She struggles to keep up with energy costs in her private rented home. Grace had built up a £350 energy debt on her prepayment meter and couldn't afford to replace her broken fridge-freezer.

National Energy Action secured £700 towards her energy account debt, provided her with £147 in energy vouchers and negotiated her debt repayment to an affordable £2 a month.

Our crisis fund was used to replace her broken freezer, and she was placed on the Priority Services Register.

NEWS IN BRIEF

- More than 3,000 people supported by specialist energy advice and benefit teams, with more than £1.8 million in previously unclaimed benefits secured for clients.
- We have spoken to over 3,740 people at more than 220 community events.
- More than **370 frontline professionals trained** on health risks of cold homes and CO safety.
- Working in partnership with more than 20 specialist energy advice and support organisations, and more than 54 health, social care and third sector referral partners.
- Delivered a well-attended drop-in event for referral partners to **share their experience** of working with the programme.
- The network of delivery partners met for another forum to support one another and share successes and best practice so far.
- Supported people with essential gas appliance servicing and referred to funding to help the client where needed.



DID YOU KNOW?

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colourless, odourless, poisonous gas. It's produced when fuels like gas, oil, wood or coal don't burn completely, often due to a lack of oxygen caused by poor ventilation or a faulty gas appliance.

Exposure to CO can cause nausea, weakness, sleepiness and death.

National Energy Action is tackling the risk of CO poisoning by:

- Issuing carbon monoxide detectors
- Servicing faulty gas appliances
- Training front line staff and communities

IN PRACTICE - UNDER ONE ROOF?

Government would like to see health services provided at a community level all under one roof. However, primary, secondary and social care services are often located across a community.

Over 80% of Warm Home, Healthy Futures partners visit people in their homes and help connect these services directly to people who are unwell.

Although spring is in the air and temperatures are steadily rising, so is the cost of energy. The **energy price cap is set at £1,849 per year for a typical household** paying by direct debit until June 2025. Leaving vulnerable householders on fixed incomes to choose between food or fuel, putting their health at risk.

In December 2024, the total amount of energy debt owed to suppliers stood at £3.85billion with an average of £1,541 owed by each householder. (Ofgem)

New polling by National Energy Action with YouGov finds 56% of adults in Wales are likely to ration energy in the coming months.

National Energy Action helps householders with energy debts by linking people with a specialist debt advice agency and carrying out benefit entitlement checks.
